Contents:

Each full shipping box contains 2 Quilt Garden Kits.

Each Quilt Garden kit includes:

150 rooted liners, 3 trays of 50 liners. This is enough to plant 50 pots or baskets, 8 to 10" in size.

50 full color, double sided 4" x 7" hanging tags for each Quilt Garden kit shipped. One tag for each container planted.

Production and promotion tips.

Handling Instructions On Arrival:

Remove plants immediately upon arrival and place them on a warm greenhouse bench in bright light.

Water if needed.

Planting Instructions:

The rooted Quilt Garden Liner label lists the name of the kit, name of the crop and the variety number 1, 2 or 3.

Each garden contains 3 plants, enough for an 8" or 10" container or basket.

Plant one of each variety in the center of the container as shown. Liners should be planted so that the root ball of each are touching, this assures a natural look to the finished basket.

For 12" to 18" containers or baskets, plant 2 kits into the container as shown. For these larger containers always combine the same kit. For example don't combine Grandmothers Flower Garden with Patriot Puzzle because the habit or color combination will not give your customer the optimum results. Place all plants near the center of the container as shown.

Typical Production Crop Time:

10" container – 8 weeks12" container – 10 weeks 14" container – 12 weeks

Retail Presentation:

For basket on the bench presentations, attach the tag at the top of the hanger, this will draw the customer's eye up and create interest even in the early stages of your Patchwork Quilt Garden and invites your customer to read the Quilt story on each tag.

For overhead presentations, attach the tags so that they hang below the basket at or near eyelevel of the shopper also inviting them to read the Quilt story.
